
What Did Paul Mean with Predestination?

'And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose. For <u>whom he did foreknow</u>, <u>he also did predestinate</u> to be conformed to the **image of his Son'** (Romans 8:28,29)

God is Not Bound by Time Like Us 'For whom he did foreknow, he also did

predestinate..'

Outside the parameters of our four dimensions of a: time, b: length, c: width and d: height, time does not really exist and goes both ways, backwards and forwards. God, who is from a much



higher dimension, can see the future and which upcoming decisions that we are going to make.

Our Predestination is in Our Hands

If the decisions that we will make are in line with his spirit of love that he breathed into us, then God will help us and protect us up to a certain point, so we can eventually arrive at the point where we can make those important decisions.

In the light of these decisions that we will personally make we impact our future in a certain direction and in doing this we predestine ourselves.

God absolutely does not predestine us, because that would take away our free will of decision making, with which we set the course to our destination in advance. Like we PRE-BOOK a hotel, so we decide our DESTINATION in advance - PRE-DESTINATION.

It says, *'he did foreknow,'* or he already knows beforehand, what decisions we will make, as he sees the future, but **THE DECISIONS ARE 100 % OURS.**

God Works Behind the Scenes

We see many examples where God knew that we were going to make the right decision. With this in mind he orchestrated or allowed particular, often difficult situations to occur, where our character could be tested, and we could make these important and often life-changing decisions. God does not predestine us, but because he can see the future and knows what decisions we will make, he sets things into motion, so that we can make these key decisions.



God Will Not Override Us

We are the only ones shaping our own destiny and predestining our future.

When it comes to decision making we are equal to God. Yes, he can, but although God is all powerful, he has set certain boundaries for himself that he cannot and will not cross. He will not override our decisions.

'being <u>predestinated</u> according to the purpose of him who works all things <u>after the counsel of his</u> own will:' (Ephesians 1:11)

God will not **'after the counsel of his own will'** make the decisions for us, that is our personal, individual, majestic prerogative, of which we also reap the results, whether good or bad.

Character Building or Shifting the Blame?

You and I build our personal character by the decisions that we make. The responsibility of the decision rests with you and me... I cannot blame the TV for wasting my time, when I hold the remote control with the on/off switch in my hand. I cannot blame my decisions on Satan or whatever excuse I want to use to shift the blame away from myself on to something or someone else.

I cannot say, 'It was because of Adam and Eve sinning that I am making the wrong choices', or 'the Devil made me do it' The Devil can do nothing, niente, nada, nichts, rien, ничто, niks, if we don't allow him.

Are We Worthy?

In each of our lives, the Lord wishes to bring out the best in us and to test our character by our decisions. It is to see if we are worthy to be his Bride. If we decide for him then he will care for us like a doting husband. *'For your Maker is your husband'* (Isaiah 54:5)

A Cherokee Folktale

There is a war going on inside of us which is strikingly described in the following Cherokee folktale. The grandson of the Cherokee chief had been causing trouble in the camp and was called into the chief's tepee. "Son, each one has two wayas, two wolves, inside of him, which fight to dominate our life. Each person has this fight going on inside of him."

Heading Down the Wrong Track

Whatever decisions we make sets our life on a certain track, so we need to be extremely careful what predestination we choose. Once we travel in a certain direction the speed increases. If we don't like the direction where we are headed, it is awfully difficult to pull the emergency chain and make a U-turn.

High Security Walls

All of us have made wrong decisions and headed towards the wrong destination. During our life we hurt, we build walls. We don't apologize or forgive to make things right. We fortify our walls till they've become our 'high security prison'. None in - none out. These "protective" walls are our sin and *"the takehome pay of sin is death;"* (Romans 6:23A) It's death to our love and our happiness. Things in life become complicated and confusing.

So What is the Solution?

This is where Jesus comes in, as the next part of that verse says, "but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus". He cut through all the complexities by saying, "A new commandment I give to you that you love one another as I have loved you.." (John 13:34) Simple as that. This puts all of us on equal footing as sinners, as we all have failed in loving others.

His Question for Our Choice

When they crucified Jesus and were pounding the nails through his hands and feet, he said, *"Father, forgive them for they don't know what they do."* (Luke 23:34) If he can forgive them, then he can forgive us.
