## **Roadblocks to a Successful Marriage**

Lines like, "you ALWAYS..." or "you NEVER..." will kill your communication as it puts your partner on the defence looking for a way to retaliate. If you raise your voice

your partner can no longer hear what you try to say as the volume is too loud and

condescending. We want our spouse to be like us, but we are different and we need room to breathe.

Protect your Children from Your Arguments as they will withdraw. Let children be children. Seeing you love each other stimulates their brain functions.

## **ZIP IT, Go for a Walk, Cool Down**

Take time out. "Let nothing be done through strife or vain glory; but in **lowliness of mind** let each esteem the other better than themselves." (Philippians 2:3)



Hear from the Lord. "Then shall you call, and the LORD shall answer... IF you take away... pointing the finger,

and speaking vanity\*" (Isaiah 58:9)

\* (Dictionary for Vanity: Pride, Narcissism, Conceit, Selfimportance, Arrogance, Big-headedness, Egotism) When you have calmed down, apologize for raising your voice. If you want the last word in an argument, a sincere apology will do it.

Nagging is another killer. "He that covers a transgression seeks love; but he that <u>repeats a</u> <u>matter</u> (nags) <u>separates</u> very friends." (Prov.17:9) or separates the best marriage partners.

## What is the Solution?

Take time out to open your heart and communicate, be respectful of each other's feelings. The best thing is to start with a prayer and request the Lord's help.

Give your spouse the chance to speak first, just listen and honestly try to understand his/her point of view; just like when you were first together. Do NOT interrupt when your partner shares their heart.



Now when he/she is finished and you have listened, it's your turn, not to get back but to share your heart. Start with, "I appreciate you and thank you for putting up with me and loving me in spite of being a pain in the neck." Then you should humbly express how you feel. I.e. "When this happens I feel like a child, or I think my work is not appreciated." Try to understand each other's point of view and apologize for your behaviour. This will clear the air. Then agree on certain changes, i.e. to take weekly or bi-weekly an evening off for a walk together or to go to the restaurant. Invest in your friendship.

instructions to deliver you. "You have delivered me from the violent man." (Psalms 18:48)
