- 2, the **Red Horseman** with the red bloody sword of our country's military machine;
- 3, the Black Horseman of business-suits and taxes;
- 4, the last and ending Pale Horseman: Death.

We started out and got carried away with the political promises and fell for the alleged white and noble causes of nationalistic and/or religious fervour of our high-riding leader on his white horse.

Because of these noble causes, we decided to join the <u>red horseman</u> with the sword of the glorified military war machine, red with blood.

We were thrilled to be tested to the limit of our human endurance with the distinct possibility of making the ultimate sacrifice for our fatherland. But when we returned the reality dawned on us that we stained our swords with the blood of not only soldiers but also innocent women and children.

We were shocked when we came to the realisation that we rode these two horses for the benefit of the ones riding the <u>black horse</u> of business in black suits, who made huge profits on these wars and us giving our lives for what? 'Was it really for freedom, for our children, for our future, was it really against that person being such a dictator and did we really do it for democracy OR was it for some other reasons and did we leave that country in shambles, so big business could profit from the weapon and arm sales, the oil, the gold, the minerals, the crops and riches of that country, which our black horse riders are cashing in on with enormous lucrative deals? Is that why we killed these people?'



As we started to realise what it was all about, we began to contemplate to end our life and possibly surrender to the last, and final pale horseman: with his colour of Death. "Shall I just end it all?" and some of us did.

No human being had the strength to break the sweeping fascination that these horsemen have over us and to expose to us the spiritual powers of what is going on in our life.

Even in heaven they couldn't find any angel or saint to expose and show the world how these horsemen run side by side to conquer the souls of mankind.



'And I saw a strong angel proclaiming with a loud voice, "Who is worthy to open the book, (of

world history) and to loosen the seals thereof?"
And no man in heaven, nor in earth, neither under the earth, was able to open the book... And I wept much, because no man was found worthy to open and read the book, neither to look thereon. And one of the elders said unto me, Weep not: look, the Lion of the tribe of Juda, the Root of David, has prevailed to open the book, and to undo the seven seals of it.

And I looked..., and in the midst of the elders, stood a Lamb as it had been slain, 'You are worthy to take the book, and to open the seals thereof: for you were slain, and have redeemed us to God by your blood out of every kindred, and tongue, and people, and nation; And have made us unto our God kings & priests and we shall reign on the earth.' (Rev.5:2-12)

Only Jesus, known as the Lamb of God, could expose and break the power that these four horsemen have over us since the beginning of time.

However, if, when we are about to join the fourth pale horseman: Death, we can find the grace to reach out to Jesus and ask him for forgiveness **no matter how shameful** our deeds were, then he will open our eyes and cleanse us. He will make us new and our tears will wash away our excruciating nightmares of unbearable guilt, and it will be replaced with peace that passes all understanding. We are not able to comprehend his genuine allencompassing forgiveness and concern for us in spite of what we have done, until we decide to reach out to him...

Listen to this true account:

"There came a leper to Jesus, imploring him, and kneeling down, saying, 'If you will, you can make me clean.' And Jesus, moved with compassion, put forth his hand, and touched him, and said to him, 'I will; you be clean.' And as soon as he had said it, immediately the leprosy departed from him, and he was cleansed." (Mark 1:40-42)

Here you see Jesus having empathy and touching the leper which was totally forbidden by the law. People threw stones at lepers to keep them away.

May we never think that Jesus will throw stones at any of us for what we've done, on the contrary he



said, 'Whoever comes to me I will never cast out or reject.' (Jn.6:37)
Some of us might think, 'I am no leper I am a dead man walking.' But that is no excuse to not come to Jesus as he raised Lazarus and a few

others from the dead. **That <u>choice of Jesus</u>** is **ours alone**, nobody can make this decision for us...

Not God, nor Satan can choose for us, nor can we pass the blame to our former commanding officer, because this is our personal birthright and responsibility. In Jesus we will find the strength to forgive others and even forgive ourselves.

This simple prayer starts us in the right direction:

"Dear Jesus, as you know in my ignorance I used your name as a curse word. I now come to you like that leper did, asking that if you will, that you please make me clean. I know that I am on the scrapheap, I have fallen in a hell hole of depression and cannot get out. I totally don't deserve your healing nor your forgiveness; but I ask for your mercy as mercy is only shown to the undeserving of who I am the least.



I will read what your disciples Matthew, Mark, Luke and John recorded about you so I can get to know you better. If you can help me then I'd like to be of help to someone else, so my life will again have a bit of meaning.

I would really appreciate that. Thank you"

'And the Lord said, "A new spirit will I put within you. I will take away the stony heart out of your flesh and give you a heart of flesh. (Eze.11:19) Where old things are passed away and all things are become new." (2Cor.5:17)

If we were willing to fight and lay down our lives for our fatherland with these disastrous mental consequences, then should we not be more than willing to dedicate our lives for the Kingdom of our true heavenly Father, where the ultimate power is love and forgiveness?

The apostle Paul said, 'I die daily'. What he was trying to say is. 'I put aside my personal desires to bring others into the safety and freedom of my Father's Kingdom.'

Jesus said, "the Kingdom of God is inside you." (Luke 17:21) He also said, 'The Kingdom of heaven suffers violence but the violent take it by force.' (Mat.11:12)
