

Jesus said, 'for this cause was I born and came into the world to be a witness of the truth and he who wants the truth will listen to me.' (John 18:37)

These found the Truth and stuck it out. Also Judas was chosen and although he followed Jesus three years, it is good to know [why he betrayed](#) Jesus and see how we'd have done, were we in Judas' shoes? Then there is the closest inner circle of Peter, James and John. These came along when he raised Jairus' daughter (Luke 8:51), went with him up the mount of transfiguration (Mat.17:1), and were near to him in the garden of Getsemany (Mark 14:33). Why them?



Peter asked questions, and also stuck his foot in his mouth, but was crazy enough to step out on the water. When Jesus said, 'Come' he came! (Mt.14:29)

John had no fear; he just loved the Lord, even rested his head on Jesus' bosom during the last supper.

(John 13:23) James and John were brothers and were called 'the sons of thunder' (Mark 3:17). So, John and James must have been trusting powerhouses.

The Young Apostles

Jesus' apostles were mostly below the age of 20 or 21. The Jews started paying temple tax at the age of twenty, while Roman tribute money was for every adult male, so either 20 or 21.

Matthew records, 'they that received tribute money asked Peter, Does your master not pay tribute?' - Obviously, Jesus was older than 21 and Peter must have still looked under 21 as they only asked about Jesus not paying. But Jesus told Peter, 'Give unto them for me and you.' Mat 17:24-27.

From this we see that the rest of Jesus' disciples were in their middle or late teens. We know that teens are not too worried about Sabbath days and they eat with unwashed hands. Jesus even called them 'paidia', Greek for children or lads - (John 21:5). In the same chapter (John 21) he asks Simon Peter, 'Do you love me more than these?'



Here Jesus was pointing at the huge catch of 153 big fishes. [Fishing was Peter's life that he loved.](#) Was he willing to leave the fishing

behind to feed the young believers - Jesus' lambs? In order to drive the point home, Jesus asks him three times, 'Do you love me? Do you love me? Do you love me... then feed my sheep.' Peter tries to turn the spotlight away from his heart and asks, 'But what about him?' pointing at John. Jesus responds with, 'What is that to you? You need to follow me.'

True discipleship is more than standing up once in a meeting with, 'I take Jesus'. Jesus gave his all in the hope that some of us would give their all, in return. He was undivided, how undivided are we and willing to [surrender our personal plans and will](#) to the Lord?

Satan will pull out all stops before you surrender your life and he might even give you that promotion. He'll tell you, 'You won't be enjoying life anymore, you'll be a brainwashed zombie; no longer a free thinker, but a pious, self-righteous, nice "Christian"'. Jesus called Satan the father of lies and he is so good at it that he had me hoodwinked for some 20 years. So, what changed my mind, me, a market-boy with money, who loved dancing; a girlfriend on the right arm and a drink in the left hand. No Bible for me!

What changed?

When we read his true life story in [Matthew, Mark, Luke & John](#), then we see a person who loved life to the full. His first miracle is 600 litres of the very best wine, he healed

people, gave the demon haunted back their sanity, singlehandedly threw the money-grabbers out of the temple, stood his ground against the Religious Rulers and told them, 'he that's not for me is against me.' “What are you, in your heart of hearts, Johan?”

“I am a missionary, Lord, for you.”

“Then you work for me and follow my guidance and I will pay the bills. There are many people that want a job for money, but so little few want to serve me. Stick with me and I will take care of you and yours.”
“Thank you, that settles it then?” - ‘Yes, you'll see!’
