

Although it was not a big collision it ripped holes into the lower side of the ship. Five of the ships sixteen compartments began to fill with water. The enormous ship slowly began to sink. The ship's crew began putting people into the lifeboats. The Titanic was designed to carry 32 lifeboats, but there were only 20 on board and so on that fatal night 1496 people lost their lives. The unsinkable ship sank after 2 hours and 40 minutes at 2:20 A.M. in the early morning of April 15th, 1912.

What can we learn from this?

It is a lesson for our personal life and even for our whole world. If we think ourselves to be a Titan, a person of very great importance, strength, intellect and we have no need for God, because we think that God is useless and cannot do anything anyway. If we show him the finger and challenge him, as we speed towards our goals, then we might be in for a surprise heading towards disaster and we might unexpectedly get sideswiped by an iceberg that we did not see coming as we throttle full speed along with no time to stop, except getting smashed for a couple of weeks during our yearly holidays.


Maybe some of us are wiser than that, but what are the little leaks and secret sins below the water line of our personal ship, that no one sees? Little leaks sink great ships, maybe not as dramatic as the Titanic sank, and maybe we won't take as many people down with us as the Titanic did, although none of us are an island and we influence others. Yet slowly but surely, the leaks, however small, will eventually cause our ship to sink and go down into the forgotten abyss. That is, unless we repent, and stop to repair those 'little' leaks, but if we just shrug them off then we might be in for a surprise. King David prayed: 'Please cleanse me from secret sins and hold me back from the sins of pride; let them not rule my life.' (Psalm 19:12,13)

When the captain of the Titanic made that proud statement, God himself was listening, and honestly, it is not the wisest thing to challenge the Creator of heaven and earth like that. Because '*nothing is impossible with God*' (Luke 1:37) as is manifested in that unsinkable ship resting at the bottom of the Atlantic Ocean.

If the captain only could have said, "I would like to give credit to the engineers and the ship builders for the amazing work they have done. I am honoured to be the captain of such a masterpiece and in all humility, I like to ask the Most-High to bless this ship on its journeys and that it may serve mankind and its purpose for many years to come."

If he could have said that, then he would have listened to the iceberg warnings, slowed down the ship and be more careful. But in our pride, we push the counsel of others aside and the result can be devastating as it was in this case. Our words are **containers of power** and we don't realize what we set into motion with our statements and what powers we release into the universe.

The Titanic did not have to go down on its maiden journey, but the ship could have lasted for many decades to come. It could still be moored in some harbour as an attraction, or a five-star hotel. How could I say that with certainty? Because that is how the Lord works; he's like a doting parent who is proud and protective of the child that honours him. "But we've grown up and don't need God anymore; a crutch for the weak; a delusion from the dark ages. We know better now." In our arrogance we ignore our Creator, "Can't you see how smart we are? We can create A.I. and A.G.I. androids, intercontinental ballistic missiles with nuclear warheads, drones, carpet bombs, bunker busters, etc., etc." When will our ship our hit that Nuclear Iceberg?

He mismanaged funds which I had designated for certain payments, but he used for personal needs.

I don't think that the Lord, like us, wants to keep investing in a ship that continues to spring leaks.

However, the other person was trustworthy and built his business by gaining the trust of people and keeping his word. He steadily got more clientele and is now well established in his line of business.

I also sprung some 'anger' leaks, which I knew I had to stop as it was ruining my ship. I got on my knees many a time and apologized to the ones affected by me and thank God, it seems like it lost its grip and hold on me, as the consequences and the following guilt feelings were and are still very painful. I know that I have to watch out for any potential iceberg run-ins that could spring another 'anger' leak. I can honestly say, 'Here but for the grace of God go I.'

Simon Peter did when he saw the wind and waves, he began to sink, but he cried out: "Lord, save me!!!"

'Jesus immediately stretched out his hand and saved him.' (Mat.14:28-31) Peter got thrown off because he looked at the circumstances instead of Jesus. We might say, "Well my ship already lies at the bottom, I couldn't get any lower; I am a dead man." Lazarus was dead for four days and Jesus raised him up, as well as a few others.

There's really no excuse for not reaching out our hand and asking him to save us. Any drowning man when he gets thrown a life saver will grab onto it.


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WHAT CAN WE TAKE AWAY FROM THE TITANIC ?



Titanic means: exceptional strength, size or power. (Oxford) The Titanic was the largest cruise ship in the world at the time: 882 feet (269 meters) long, over 100 feet (30.5 meters) tall with ten 10 levels or decks. The Titanic was supposedly one of the safest ships. To prevent leaks, its hull had two layers of steel. It had 16 compartments that could be sealed off using watertight steel doors.

If the ship did spring a leak, the doors would close, to keep the ship from sinking. The ship could carry 2,453 passengers and 900 crew. The first-class area was like an elaborate hotel with swimming pool, gym, library, cafes, etc.



"Even God himself couldn't sink this ship" is believed to be said by Edward John Smith, the captain of the ship.

The Titanic left from England and even though the captain was warned about icebergs in the northern waters, the Titanic went full speed across the Atlantic. On the night of April 14th a giant iceberg was spotted in its path. The captain tried to steer away from the iceberg, but it was too late. The iceberg cut into the side of the ship at 23:40 hours. The designers did not foresee that an iceberg could cut into the side of the ship, while passing.
