

Eye popping clarification about demonic assignments on our life, and how to break them.

My name is Nash. My father was a church deacon, a respected man, everybody loved him on Sundays, but behind our front door he was somebody else. He beat my mother every Saturday night, then stood at the pulpit Sunday morning like nothing happened.

So, by the time I was 13, I wanted nothing to do with the Bible, nothing to do with God and that is when a man in my town, a man everybody respected, saw something in me; my anger, my hurt and told me, 'Real power does not come from a book, real power comes from the other side;' I believed him, for 19 years inside the organization, **I was trained in scripture suppression**, that is what they called it.

When I joined at the age of 13 the instructor had an open Bible in front of him. To destroy the enemy, you have to know their strategy and the weapon of the church is this book. Most of them don't know how to use it and that is to our advantage.

Then he opened to the book of Psalms and he said this right here is the most dangerous section for us, which causes the most problems.

My job was to study the Bible more closely than most pastors do, figure out which part were the

most dangerous to the kingdom of darkness and then deploy specific assignments to keep Christians from ever reading these parts. I targeted over 300 persons personally. **My success rate was 87%.** That means out of every hundred 87 of them stopped reading the passages we feared. They thought that they made their own choices what to read, and that they preferred certain Psalms above others. The reason they never opened to Psalm 68 or 149 was because they were never taught about them. It was not random; it was strategic. Every Christian I targeted had a personalized suppression plan. We studied their reading plan, church environment, their pastors teaching style and prayer patterns.

I trained under three different instructors over these 19 years. Each one teaching me different. The first taught me about **the poetry assignment**; making people think the Psalms are beautiful poetry. The second one taught me about **selective reading**; let people be comfortable with only reading a few Psalms. The third, the most experienced operative taught me about **the silence assignment**. This means when people would read the psalms out loud, we would disturb their time doing this. If all distractions failed then we would seek to **silence their voice**; a sore throat, a burning sensation; all to silence them from reading out loud.

By the time I finished my training I could identify a believer's scripture weakness within a week.

The book we feared the most was the book of Psalms. Christians had turned the most dangerous book in the Bible into background noise, into verses on greeting cards, beautiful words for difficult days. And we absolutely loved it. I'll tell you why the book of Psalms terrifies the kingdom of darkness more than any other book in the Bible.

There is a difference between reading a Psalms and declaring a Psalms. The difference between prayers that don't go past the ceiling and those that shake the foundations of hell.

The other books tell us about the war, but in this book are the weapons; every verse is a declaration. **When a believer reads these out loud and declares the verses then we cannot hold our ground.**

The first was the poetry assignment, beautiful poetic words but not functional, not operational weapons. My first assignment was Linda, a schoolteacher she would read a few verses of the Psalms in the morning and then close the book saying these are beautiful words and then go make breakfast. So she was already fulfilling my assignment; easy for me, as she would never read them out loud never declaring them over her life; never using them as authority over the assignments we had placed over her life. Her husband had lost his job six months earlier, her son was falling into the wrong crowds, there was a health scare with her youngest daughter.

This was our work, targeted assignments one after another. And every morning Linda opened the book that could have destroyed every one of our assignments, but she said it was nice and closed it. 87% Linda was part of that 87%.

I had another target named Roy, a mechanic, a decent man in a small town and worked out of a shop behind his house. He had a Bible next to his toolbox. At lunch break he would eat his sandwich and read from the Psalms. Roy had been reading the Psalms for 20 years, but never had read them out loud to declare them over his family, his shop, his finances. He read them like he read the newspaper. Closed the book and go on with his work. And the whole time we had assignments running on his family; his daughter had been struggling with depression since she was 14, his wife had chronic migraines that no doctor could explain, while Roy had a blockage on his business. He was the best mechanic in three counties, but he could never keep more than 2 or 3 customers at the time.

People would come once, love his work and then something made them forget about him. They would drive past his shop but not see it, as we had

placed a visibility seal on his shop. Yet, every day he was six inches away from the book that could have shattered that seal. I reported to my instructor. He laughed, **'Roy is our favourite kind of Christian, he reads the weapon manual every day, but he never loads the gun.'**

What he was saying stuck with me, as he was saying that the **Psalms are loaded weapons** and the Christians treat them like paperweights.

Some knew that the Psalms were important and we would try to lock them into reading assignments of Psalm 23, 91, 27, 51 maybe 103. These are powerful Psalms, but **these are only 6 while there are 150.**

This is like a solder using his pistol, when there are other weapons, grenades, rockets, swords, shields and weapons that he has never touched. We made sure it stayed that way, as assignments have a limit, and they can be destroyed with time.

There was **Karl, a truck driver**, he read Psalm 23 and 91 and prayed out loud while driving his truck. He had a financial assignment against him; we had put a seal on his income. Every time he'd get ahead; his truck would break down, a medical bill, an unforeseen expense would show up; that was us, that was coordinated. There are specific Psalms that **target financial assignments: Psalms 37, 112, 128.**

These talk about God blessing the work of your hands, about abundance, but he never read these, as that could have shattered our assignment. His wife a good woman almost left him twice because at night they would argue about the bills. We kept Karl in the selective reading assignment and it worked: Psalms 23 and 91. These psalms were like **a warm blanket to him instead of a loaded weapon.** He was comfortable with those psalms and we had a saying a comfortable Christian is a controllable Christian.

When you always read the same Psalms, there are gaps in your armour that the organisation knows. And they will target you there in your gaps. When you **make a declaration** and you **put it in writing** then something shifts in the spirit realm.

When you speak the Psalms out loud and you declare the ones that the organisation fears the most, because not all the psalms are equal, then you create a ring of fire around yourself.

If you do not know **Psalm 68, stop now and read it.** In the organisation we call this Psalm **'the scatterer'**, because that is exactly what it does.

'Let God arise, let his enemies be scattered: let them also that hate him flee before him. As smoke is driven away, so drive them away: as wax melts before the fire, so let the wicked perish at the presence of God.' (Psalms:68 1, 2)

When you **read this out loud, you don't just scatter specific assignments, you scatter entire operations against you; coordinated assignments, layered strategies, all of it gets disrupted.**

I watched it happen with a family. The father's name was **Paul**. We had a coordinated assignment on his family: a financial block on his business, health assignment on his wife, confusion assignment on his oldest son, and a marital division assignment between Paul and his wife. **Four layers, four different operatives working together; we had that assignment for two years running.** Paul then joined a prayer group and was advised to **read Psalm 68 daily out loud.** He did, the assignment started to shatter. First the financial assignment cracked; he got a business deal that doubled his income. His son lost interest in the friends that pulled him away. His wife was healed overnight from a chronic backpain and finally, Paul and his wife started praying together. When I told the higher ups about Paul, they were furious, because **they knew that if believers would ever discover to speak Psalms 68 with authority, our operations would collapse.**

Psalm 35 we called **'the fighter'**. While 68 scatters the enemy 35 fights them directly. ***'Plead my cause, O LORD, fight against them that fight against me.'*** **Now write this out: 'Every hidden enemy fighting my life is exposed and defeated in Jesus' name.'**

We had a poverty assignment running for six years against **Denise, single mum**, three kids, worked two jobs just to keep the lights on. She was praying, fasted and tithed faithfully; nothing changed until she got a note from her grandmother, 'Denise, baby stop asking God politely, tell the enemy to get out, read Psalm 35 morning and night do not whisper it, declare out loud as your own.'

She did so twice a day in her living room. After two months the poverty assignment cracked. She got a promotion that was passed her up three times; her car, that we had been sabotaging, stopped breaking down, a hospital bill over 4000 dollars was forgiven by the hospital out of nowhere.

When I told my higher ups, they said something I'll never forget, **'Once a believer starts using Psalm 35 as a personal weapon Pull Back,** reassign to another target. That Psalm creates a fight in the spirit realm that costs too much to sustain.'

The next is **Psalm 91.** We didn't fear people reading it after an attack. We feared those who read it **proactively daily** as a standing declaration over their household. When prayed and declared proactively it creates what the higher-ups call **'a shield dome'** over them, making it extremely difficult for assignments to penetrate.

If someone was declaring **Psalm 149, all operations against this person were immediate suspended, not pulled back, suspended** as it binds their strong enemies with chains. (Psalm 149:8,9)

*'To bind their kings with chains, and their nobles with fetters of iron; To execute upon them the judgment written: **this honour have all his saints.'***

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
